

Statement from the American Muslim Health Professionals (AMHP) On The White House Position on Autism

September 23rd, 2025

American Muslim Health Professionals (AMHP) joins the Society for Maternal–Fetal Medicine (SMFM), the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG), and the American Psychiatric Association (APA) in affirming that the latest, most substantiated clinical evidence demonstrates no association between acetaminophen (tylenol) use in pregnancy and the development of autism spectrum disorder. When clinically indicated, acetaminophen remains an appropriate first-line option for treating pain and fever in pregnancy- both of which can pose substantial risks to healthy fetal development.

AMHP encourages the public, clinicians, and policymakers to consult the Autism Science Foundation’s statement and resources for clear, up-to-date information on off-label treatments including leucovorin, the lack of association between vaccines and autism, and the importance of continued rigorous research to guide counseling and decision-making.
